

## Report Card: Michigan 27, Penn State 25

POSITION	COMMENTS
<b>Quarterbacks</b> <b>B</b>	Robinson did lead a 13-play, 81-yard drive to regain the lead. But an early fumble and a late interception stung. Zero first-half points didn't help either.
<b>Running backs</b> <b>A-</b>	Call Hunt rock steady. He picked up blitzes again, ran for his third 100-yard rushing game this year. Picked up a block on M-Rob's key fourth-down run.
<b>Wide receivers</b> <b>B</b>	If the ball was near their hands, they caught it. Williams and co. weren't fazed by the atmosphere — if only more balls were thrown deep early.
<b>Offensive line</b> <b>B+</b>	They seem to get better week-by-week. Robinson had adequate time in the pocket. Draw plays appear to be their specialty. Penalties hurt, though.
<b>Defensive line</b> <b>C</b>	Henne sat pretty in the pocket most of the day. The pressure was non-existent on the final drive as containment appeared more important than a big rush.
<b>Linebackers</b> <b>B-</b>	Not their best day, certainly. Hart was virtually never stopped on first hit. The unit failed to get to Henne, even on blitzes. Substitution issues on Hart's TD.
<b>Secondary</b> <b>C</b>	The final play can't be ignored. Definitely a mistake somewhere; where, who knows? Henne tested King on balls often, Manningham played like a veteran.
<b>Special teams</b> <b>D</b>	Kelly missed two crucial field goals on the road. Kicking to Breaston proved to be detrimental in the second half. Kapinos redeemed himself from OSU.
